





PLACES TO VISIT

OLD BRIDGE IN MOSTAR



The historic town of Mostar, spanning a deep valley of the Neretva River, developed in the 15th and 16th centuries as an Ottoman frontier town and during the Austro-Hungarian period in the 19th and 20th centuries.

BLAGAJ



Hands down, one of the most aweinspiring locations on the planet. Blagaj is a must-visit in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and its famous Tekija is the most must-visit spot of this must-visit town.

ŽITOMISLIĆI MONASTERY



Žitomislić Monastery is one of the most culturally significant Orthodox monasteries in Herzegovina from the 16th century, and is dedicated to the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

OLD TOWN POČITELJ



The historic urban site of Počitelj is located on the left bank of the river Neretva, on the main Mostar to Metković road, to the south of Mostar, in the territory of Čapljina Municipality.

HUTOVO BLATO



Hutovo blato is a bird reserve and nature park in the south of Bosnia and Herzegovina, not far from Čapljina. Hutovo blato, as the last Mediterranean swamp, is a wonderful green oasis of rich and untouched nature with a large number of endemic species.

VILLA RUSTICA MOGORJELO



Mogorjelo is one of the most important monuments of the Roman era in Bosnia and Herzegovina and belongs to the most beautiful buildings of late antique architecture. It is located in the immediate vicinity of Čapljina.

CAVE VJETRENICA



Vjetrenica is the largest cave in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the most biodiverse cave in the world. It is part of the Dinaric Alps mountain range, which is known for its karstic and speleological features.

ZAVALA MONASTERY



Monastery Zavala is on the edge of Popovo polje, under Ostrog mountain. There are no reliable sources about its construction date. This monastery has a specific position, so the architectural style is matching.

OLD TOWN TREBINJE



Old town of Trebinje was formed because Turks needed organization of their territories in Herzegovina due to great changes in wars with the Holy league (1683-1699) - the fall of Herceg Novi and Risan under the rule of Republic of Venice.

DUBROVNIK



Dubrovnik is a city in the extreme south of Croatia and one of the most important historical and touristic centers of Croatia. The old town of Dubrovnik has been on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 1979

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
